## **Sun Protection Policy**

To promote among students, staff and parents –

- Positive attitudes towards skin protection.
- Lifestyle practices which can help reduce the incidence of skin cancer and the number of skin cancer related deaths.
- Personal responsibility for and decision making about skin protection.
- Awareness of the need for environmental changes in schools to reduce the level of exposure when the UV index is 3 or over.

## Purpose

The purpose of the policy is to ensure that strategies are in place for all members of our school community in protecting them from skin damage caused by the harmful ultraviolet rays from the sun. The school is ideally placed to help reduce the incidence of skin cancer and encourage all members of the school community to use effective skin protection measures.

## Policy detail / actions

This policy is for implementation throughout the whole school year in line with Department and Cancer Council SA recommendations.

Students are required to wear a school hat (correctly fitted broad brimmed, legionnaire or bucket style) during terms 1, 3 and 4 and in term 2 whenever UV index levels reach 3 and above when they are outside. Baseball or peak caps are not acceptable as they provide inadequate protection.

**Term 1** – School hats required for playtimes and all outdoor activities

**Term 2** – School hats required for playtimes and all outdoor activities when the UV level is 3 or above.

During term 2 hats are kept on standby at school. Teachers to check real time UV Index prior to students exiting for play.

- **Term 3** School hats required for playtimes and all outdoor activities.
- **Term 4** School hats required for playtimes and all outdoor activities.

Students not wearing a school hat when required during play times will be asked to move to designated shaded areas of the school.

All members of the school community are strongly encouraged to use the following skin protection strategies –

- Avoid being in the direct sun without protection between the hours of 10am - 2pm (11am - 3pm daylight saving time).
- On days of extreme heat (38 degrees or more) classes will remain indoors for the lunch play period.
- Whenever possible, all outdoor activities will be scheduled before 10am and after 2pm (11am and 3pm daylight saving time), or in the shaded areas of the school where practical.
- School assemblies are held indoors in the hall.
